

 - 2 weeks intensive at UNDA on commencement
 - Study days throughout the year











SMHS Registered Mental Health Program

- ✓ Completion of Graduate Program Workbook which includes self directed learning packages, e-learning and competency assessments
- ✓ Participate in Quality Improvement Activity
- ✓ Enrolled Nurse case study presentation
- ✓ Regular reflection and goal setting with SDN



About our Hospital

- Peel Health Campus is a community hospital caring for the people of the Peel region.
- The hospital comprises of Medical, Surgical, Rehabilitation, Palliative, Dialysis, Oncology, Paediatric, Maternity, Theatre and an Emergency Department.
- We also have a range of in-patient and out-patient and day procedure services enabling it to be a major referral hospital for this region.



Graduate Programs offered



Registered Nurse (RN) & Enrolled Nurse (EN) Graduate Program (approx. 10 RN's & 3 EN's per intake)



Registered Midwifery (RM) Graduate Program (approx. 2 taken per intake)







The Ward areas for the RN/EN grads

Barker - Surgical & Medical -35 beds and x2 overflow beds. Surgeries include elective Orthopaedic, Gynaecology, ENT, elective and emergency Urology & General surgery.

Whelan – Medical ward – 40 beds and 1 overflow bed. Include Medical,12 Rehabilitation and 5 Palliative care beds.

Cove - Surgical & Medical - 20 beds and x2 overflow beds. Surgeries include elective Orthopaedic, Gynaecology, ENT, elective and emergency Urology & General surgery.

Webster – Surgical Day Procedure - 12 beds & 6 chairs. Surgeries include Eye surgery, Gynaecology, ENT, Urology.



Maternity ward for the RM grads

 Bennett – 12 beds and x3 labour suits. Day assessment unit – antenatal and post-natal clinics. Antenatal midwifery lead clinic. Obstetric clinic and Parent Education sessions.
