



## Rapid Access Giant Cell Arteritis Clinic Royal Perth Hospital

#### INFORMATION FOR PATIENTS

You are suspected of having an uncommon but serious condition called giant cell arteritis, which causes inflammation of blood vessels, typically around the head and neck.

#### When will my appointment be?

You will be contacted with an appointment by Royal Perth Hospital. It is very important that you attend this appointment as this condition requires urgent assessment.

Your appointment will be in one of the following locations (see attached map):

Royal Perth Hospital GCA Rapid Access Clinic in A Block, Level 7 (within the Eye Clinic) on Tuesday morning

#### OR

Royal Perth Hospital GCA Rapid Access Clinic in Goderich Street Outpatients (Ground Floor) on Thursday morning

#### Before your appointment

If you have been commenced on steroid medication (prednisolone) by your doctor, ensure that you take this as instructed every day.

Attend the Emergency Department if you experience any significant visual changes (double vision or vision loss – even if brief).

#### At your appointment

Please be aware that this appointment will likely take about an hour. You will be seen by a consultant rheumatologist who will perform a thorough assessment, including an ultrasound scan of the blood vessels around your temples, and organise blood tests and other scans if necessary. Please expect delays – unfortunately this is often unavoidable.

If you cannot attend this appointment for any reason, please contact the Royal Perth Hospital Switchboard on 9224 2244 and ask for the Rheumatology Registrar (during business hours)




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## Royal Perth Hospital Map


The Rapid Access GCA Clinic is located in Goderich Street Outpatient Department on Ground Floor
